The CIP e-Government LSP STORK on electronic identification (eID). STORK is a large scale pilot in the ICT-PSP (ICT Policy Support Programme under the CIP (Competitiveness and Innovation Programme), and co-funded by EU. - Context
 - Member States are being asked to report on progresses
 - The other stakeholders can contribute to the debate through CALLIOPE's WG5
 - Interoperability is considered for the purpose of "integrated, connected and interoperable continuity of care for Europe"





IOp RECOMMENDATION REVIEW

- Approach
 - WG5 provides a funnel for receiving:
 - CALLepSO input and from other associations, projects, and work groups (e.g., HPROCard)
 - Feedback from the MSs on EC follow-up questionnaire
 - With its Deliverable, WG5 will:
 - Develop a Stakeholder Response to the Recommendation
 - Engage User representatives in collecting feedback from their network of members
 - Use it as a starting point to propose how to go beyond the Recommendation into the future

WG4 CONTEXT: INTRODUCING THE ROAD MAP

- A "skeleton" (i.e., developing a frame) that facilitates the first piloting and development of a Road Map
- It is about what Member States and stakeholders, combined, aspire to achieve
- It is about accelerating eHealth implementation
- We will then prioritize issues/limit the scope of the work (according to resources of WG4)
- Basic principles of the Road Map itself:
 - common (i.e. shared); European (i.e. encompassing EU27, and preferably EU31); about eHealth interoperability





WG4 - APPROACH TO DATE

- LAUNCH: Two rounds of discussion on:
- Our own, our country's or our institution's top priorities for the eHealth interoperability Roadmap.
- Our top priorities for getting our combined priorities inserted into the Roadmap.
- OUTCOME: overview, levels of service, building blocks, views of users
- SURVEY: preparation of a "summer survey" among all CALLIOPE members (mid-July 2009 mid-August 2009)





WG4 NEXT STEPS: Until March 2010

- October: "Summer survey" results: circulate draft and finalise results
- October: Joint work group meeting outcomes: circulate and finalise results
- October/November: organise two face-to-face meetings: one on Fri Nov 13 2009, and one in January 2010 (exact dates TBC)
- November: Draw on example Member States' experiences
- Move towards finalisation of skeleton Road Map
- Begin to plan for March 2010+ activities





- Ensure epSOS outputs are provided to M403 teams for standardisation consideration






COLLABORATIONS - CALLepSO
